Have you ever considered all of the ways we experience scripture?

At the time of writing this, I have been listening to the morning sounds of the roosters crowing near the church. I have listened to this ever since I arrived at Jamestown UMC on July 5th last year.



Now, today, during Good Thursday of Holy Week, the sounds of roosters crowing are truly much more significant to me. It helps me to consider what this sound may have meant to Peter, Jesus' disciple, after the agony he experienced of denying his Lord, Teacher, and friend three times "before the cock crows three times," as Jesus told him would happen. (John 13:31-38)

Our senses play a huge part in how we experience the truth we find in God's Word. I sit in my office and smell the aromas of freshly cut palm branches, and tonight we will smell the bread, and taste the grapes and bread. We will see with our own eyes those very sights which would have been viewed by the first followers of Jesus.

Tomorrow evening, we will hear the readings of scripture, and experience more sights and sounds, touches and tasting, of those things that they might have experienced. The crowd will go from "Hosannah!" to "Crucify him!" to "Alleluia!" in just three days.

That which we take for granted easily, means so much more through the sights, sounds, taste, touch, smells of our lives. As we head into April, let us carefully consider all of the ways we really live into our senses of sight, smell, hearing, taste, and touch. How is God speaking to us?

In a world so full of excess stimulation, how might our words and actions be a *calming balm* to those whom we encounter? How might we be cognizant of Jesus' call to Peter (and to us) to feed his sheep? Sheep are just as important to Jesus today as they were back then. Jesus is called the Lamb of God in Scripture, and if we are to feed his sheep, he says that the least we do to those, we do unto him (Matt 25:37-40), this should make a difference in how we treat people. All people.

Praise be to God. Now go and hang out with some lambs – make a difference!
