

A few words from Pastor Bette....

Throughout our faith journey. We discover people, past and present who share with us their profound experiences of encountering God.

In our Bible study a few days ago, someone shared that they remembered last year's Good Friday service had been very meaningful. The Scripture readings,



dimming added to their experience of this time of worship having been deeply meaningful. Perhaps a sense of solitude helped with this.

Our Bible study groups have been studying the book Holy Solitude: Lenten Reflections with Saints, Hermits, Prophets, and Rebels written by Heidi Haverkamp, who is not just an author but an Episcopal priest.

Through her pages, and our Bibles, she is helping us to learn to be more faithful disciples of Jesus Christ, and to prepare ourselves for this Lenten/Holy Week/Easter season. In other words, through Scripture, prayer and readings we are inspired and by the Holy Spirit, we discern changes we can make in our busy schedules to think and live in a more faithful way.

The Greek word "erémos" is used in the New Testament to describe a place that is uninhabited, barren, or deserted. It often refers to physical locations such as deserts or wilderness areas, but it can also metaphorically describe a state of spiritual desolation or solitude. The word "erémos" is frequently associated with places where individuals go for prayer, reflection, or testing. In the Bible, the wilderness (or desert) holds spiritually significant symbolism. It can be seen as a place of testing, purification, and encounter with God. It can be a place of both challenge and divine revelation. It can be a place that also provides some needed quiet or freedom from disturbance.¹

It is my prayer, for our Jamestown church family and friends, that we will have a memorable and meaningful time as we grow together in faith and love. As we inch our way closer to the glorious moment when we declare with deep joy, "Alleluia! He is Risen!"

Holy Solitude: Lenten Reflections with Saints, Hermits, Prophets, and Rebels by Heidi Haverkamp

The book Holy Solitude invites readers to explore and practice solitude as alway to love God, self, and neighbor better. Through prayer and silence and through fasting and speaking truth to injustice. This daily Lenten devotional will guide the Bible Study to discover many different mentors of solitude, from Hagar to Antony the Great to Julian of Norwich to Howard Thurman. Each week of Lent addresses an aspect of solitude as a spiritual discipline, helping the reader make a sort of progression through solitude as silence, struggle, journey, hospitality and resistance to busy-ness.
