# A word from Pastor Bette...

Every once in a while, we might witness the true beauty of seeing the kingdom of God at work. My guess is that this could happen more frequently, but we might not have the eyes to see, or the ears to hear. Jesus often said to his listeners, "From everyone who has been given much, much will be demanded; and from the one who has been entrusted with much, much more will be asked." (Luke 12:48)

This is Jesus' invitation for people to "tune in" closely and pay attention and be ready to take seriously our call to do whatever we have been given to do. Pay attention. Our ears and eyes are the entry point to our minds and our hearts. How do our parents, spouses and loved ones help us to pay attention to their words? How do preachers help us to pay attention?

Sunday, I was seated at the front of the sanctuary chancel floor with the children, while we listened to Gail Greenlee with eyes and ears riveted. Her message seemed so comical, but it was actually nourishing to our bodies and our souls.

She approached the children with a curious brown paper bag filled with things. She then opened with a declaration of having a bad, bad morning, and how she could not find anything to wear for church and how she flung each of her cancelled pieces of clothing right into the air, landing on the children, we couldn't help but laugh. She finally allowed us to come to the realization that what she actually wore was just fine, and she expertly drew a parallel to the Lukan account of Jesus' visit with sisters Mary and Martha. Luke 11:1-13. Later in our worship time, the children and the teens would each go downstairs for their Sunday classes.

This moment was breath-taking to me. As I reflected, I could see the Church at work, very much like the way it is described in Acts 2. Everyone caring for one another. Everyone in agreement. Differences set aside for the sake of love...for the sake of teaching our children. To be following Jesus' command to love one another. In doing, so we are loving God. We are in worship together. In that moment, as I recall this vision, my eyes swell up in tears. Seeing the beauty of God's Kingdom at work is such a beautiful thing..

I am so sad for Gail's terrible morning, but I think it perked up after being among her church family and hearing the giggles of the kids. And I am so proud to be blessed to serve in ministry with all of the many people who help live out Jesus' command to be alert and use the gifts they have been given. It brings me deep joy.

I pray that you are listening and watching for the Holy Spirit's wisdom. I pray that you also catch glimpses of the Church at work, doing the called ministry of love. I pray that the beauty overwhelms you.
