With the recent health issues I have encountered, heart health has been a focus in my mind. The focus of the organ or muscle called the heart. Over the past month, I have spent much time monitoring my heart. Thinking about my blood pressure, and countless doctors, nurses and nurse practitioners have listened to my heart. We watched it on the monitor pumping blood back and forth. I have been challenged to rethink my heart-health, and to reconsider what habits I need to change in order to be more attuned to the well-being of my heart. There is a prime emphasis on the physical aspects of my heart health, but what about the emotional and spiritual aspects of heart health? Am I taking the necessary steps to consider how to keep my heart on track physically and spiritually? Is my heart a mess? Is it my first priority or my last thought? Do I take the necessary steps to protect it? We might hear about ways to guard our hearts. What does the bible say about the heart?

Proverbs say a lot about the heart.

Proverbs 4:23 – Above all else, guard your heart, for it is the wellspring of life.

Proverbs 14:30 – A heart at peace gives life to the body, but envy rots the bones.

Proverbs 15:13 – A happy heart makes the face cheerful, but heartache crushes the spirit.

But the biblical authors talk about the heart in many other ways that might seem strange to modern readers. And that's because these Israelites had no concept of the brain or any word for it. They imagined that all of a human's intellectual activity takes place in the heart. For example, you know with your heart. Your heart is where you understand and make connections. In the book of Proverbs, wisdom dwells in the heart. And your heart is what you use to discern between truth and error, like Solomon did when he was king.

The heart is where you think and make sense of the world, and it's where you do more. In the Bible, the heart is where you feel emotions.

When we come to know who Jesus is, and through the leading of the Holy Spirit, we ask Jesus to lead our life, we will often ask him into our hearts. The very center of our beings. We submit our will to God's will, and we open up the very core of who we are to receive him.

So, folks, we are compelled to value our hearts. We are called to pay attention to our hearts. Give our hearts the physical health they need, the nutrients and exercise to sustain them, but also pay attention to the spiritual care they need. Stay in the Word, read your bible, spend time in prayer, sit alone with God in the silence, or in nature. Attending to worship and service to others, be involved in a group that meets to study and discuss God's Word together. Be among friends who build you up and support you. These are ways we are able to stay in good heart health. **Cont on page 2**



Greetings Servants of our Lord...

On behalf of the **North District Lay Servant Committee** I greet you with information.

Now that Christmas festivities have subsided; I bring to your attention some opportunities approaching quickly.

These opportunities deal with Lay Servant classes.

First, there will be a one-hour informational meeting on Thursday, January 11 at Warsaw Trinity UMC. This meeting takes place at 7PM.

This meeting is for both lay people and clergy

There may be lay people in our churches who are not aware of Lay Servant Ministries. This is an opportunity for them to discover what is available and how it may enhance their personal ministry. Second, I am teaching a class on Polity for the Northwest District. I call it "Fun with Polity" because I do enjoy teaching the class. This class is via Zoom and will take place on the four Saturdays in January.

Third, there will be an in-person, five consecutive Saturday Academy at South Bend 1st. The dates are: February 3, 10, 17, 24 and March 2.

Conference-wide, there are many Lay Servant Ministry Academies. Some are in person, some via Zoom. Some take place over two days, others five Saturdays. Some people have limited time and thus instruction time is the priority. Others enjoy the personal interaction, connection, and fellowship of in person classes.
