A word from Pastor Bette...

In many things concerning our Christian faith, you have heard me say that repetition is a good thing. I am not kidding.

The summer season is soon approaching, and there will be the usual shifts in the church's activities. The Bible studies take a break, and our Jamestown choir also takes a rest. Many of the groups still meet, like the Lamplighters Sunday School class and Children's Church. For most, summer means we shift gears a little.



We are planning vacations, attending weddings and graduations, and the entire pace seems to shift speeds. The rhythms of life will be changing as we experience more daylight in the evenings and mornings, and the weather changes to accommodate our outdoor activities. Of course, this is nothing different – we are Hoosiers after all – and we know the drill.

In Scripture we are taught that rest is not just one of our Ten Commandments, but a gift to us from God who loves us and sets the example for the benefit of resting ourselves mentally and physically. But our faith and worship also calls for a period of rest. A different kind of rest, as we find time to be alone with God and recharge, many find their rest in being with family, friends, nature, time spent on (or near) the water.

In his book "Sabbath as Resistance: Saying No to the Culture of Now," Walter Bruggeman gives us many excellent examples of rest, and why we as God's children need rest. He also speaks of rest as a "gift" from the God of Israel. A gift given to us by God; the seventh day is to be a day of rest. God exemplifies this gift for us as we actually read about God resting on the seventh day in the story of creation. We also read about the liberation of the Israelite people from their enslavement in Egypt. You can read about this in the book of Exodus, chapters 1-15. God's care and providence are evident in how the Israelite people are led by God (through Moses and Joshua) towards their freedom.

Recently I spent some time away, and so did Tammy, our Administrative Assistant. In setting apart time for God, and for personal rest with God, we will be given that peace that Jesus speaks of un the gospels. A peace not like this world gives. Go and be the Church, friends. And enjoy these longer days and milder weather and hug your friends and family!!! Find opportunities to stop and spend quality time with God.



- Polly Brown as she recovers from knee replacement surgery and the loss of her fur baby.


