When electricity was coming out to their road, many people in the area were excited and looking forward to it. A number of the neighbors were even looking forward to being at these wonder parties at night.

When the day arrived that the electric was ran to this particular family's house, a number of folks from the surrounding farms came over to see. With a great count down, the switch was flipped and BANG above the gasps was a very loud scream. The moment the lights came on all of the dirt from the fields and the soot from the Kerosene lamps came into sharp view. They had always thought and so did everyone else that they were a clean family. As quickly as it came on, the lights were shut off and everyone was asked to leave.

The next day, as it was told to me, everyone member of that family, including all of the cousins, came to the house and started to clean! From the top to the very bottom, every surface was scrubbed and in some instances a new coat of paint was applied. The next Saturday, when folks from the surrounding farms came by to see the light, the inside of the house was just as shiny as the outside of the house.

As it was told to me, the walls were so bright you could hardly look at them without squinting. To this day, the descendants of that family still practice a spring cleaning where they scrub the entire house top to bottom scrubbing every surface and in some instances applying a new coat of paint.

When our failings and short comings are pointed out to us either by the light of a new awareness or through the intervention of someone who loves us, we tend to become defensive. The Psalmist tells us that humility and acceptance of God's grace is vital to the creation of a clean heart. (Ps 51:1-10) In the case of my Grandparent's neighbor, they chose to address this problem head on rather than avoid it or pretending that it did not exist. They did not feel shame or humiliation but determination to fix the cleanliness of their home and lives. Living today is tough and it is easy to fall into bad habits which may have started out as good ones. It is easy for our hearts to become hardened and cold because we just can't cope.

Yet, as a people of faith in Jesus Christ, we know that there is a "more excellent way" to live life. (1Cor 12:31) Do we know it? Do we accept it? Do we live it? When the lights came on for you and you knew the grace and love of a Risen Savior, did you change your life?

I would invite you to do some "spring cleaning "of your hearts and lives. I would invite you to begin again a life of service, sacrifice, and LOVE. There is a better way. Come and See.

If you should put your donation into a red envelope and do not designate where it is to go, the money counters will put it with the budget money.

Any giving MUST be in an envelope for you to receive credit on your statement. If you want your donation to go to a specific/designated fund, please write it on the **envelope** as we sometimes miss it when it is written on the check. Our offering counters continually receive designated giving that is not clearly defined on the check or envelope. There are a few extra envelopes in the pews for those times you forget your's.


2023 is the 55th year of CCS serving Elkhart County. 2023 is the 25th year of Soup of Success empowering women to make a positive change.
